

International Student Program

Kew High School is a high performing coeducational government secondary school in the leafy eastern suburbs of Melbourne with an enrolment of 1200 students and about ninety of them are international students. Over the past twenty years the school has developed a very successful International Student Program that has been evident in a high level of enrolments of international students as well as in their amazing academic achievements.

All our international students go on to tertiary studies after they finish the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) studies at Kew High School. The University of Melbourne, Monash University and RMIT are popular tertiary destinations for our students. Three of our recent international students have been School Dux, all scoring an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) above 98.70. In recent years over fifty per cent of our international students have achieved an ATAR above 90.

leading the English Language Centre (ELC) program. We also have staff of Vietnamese background to assist students and parents from Viet Nam. Our caring and experienced coordinators lead a team of teachers who guide, educate and encourage our students to settle into their new school and achieve their goals. Students are monitored and supported throughout their time at Kew and parents are regularly informed of their child's progress and well being.

We have our own on-campus ELC which allows students to study English intensively within the school and eases their transition into mainstream classes. The school's impressive facilities also include a senior centre, gymnasium, theatre, library, art gallery, ICT centre, music and performing arts centre.

Kew High School is close to a range of facilities such as supermarkets, pharmacies, medical centres, cafes, recreational centres and parks and is about 10 kms from the centre of Melbourne, well serviced by public transport with trams and buses all passing in front of the school gates. International students at Kew High School attend a high performing Victorian Government school with excellent access to all the services that make Melbourne one of the most liveable cities in the world.


International Student Leadership

Co-Curricular Activities

Students are offered a range of camps and excursions. Y12 students start Y12 each year with a study camp where they have the opportunity to listen to some of the best guest speakers in the country. The Year 11 Biology Camp is a highlight for students studying biology, spending two days at Queenscliff Marine Study Centre to study the marine environment as part of their field study work.

Throughout the school year, students are offered exciting excursions or incursions in the Arts, EAL, Physics, Chemistry, Legal Studies, Media and Theatre Studies, just to name a few. Swimming Carnival, Athletics Day, Music Festivals and other sporting and musical events are just other avenues where our students showcase their talents and get involved in a vibrant school life.

Homestay Families

All students stay with homestay families unless they live with parents or nominated third parties. Homestay families that provide accommodation to Kew High School international students have been thoroughly screened and briefed to meet the standard of accommodation provision stipulated by the International Student Division of the Department of Education and Training.

The families live near the school and provide a supportive environment where students feel safe and welcome. They provide practical and emotional advice to the students. Student homestay families are visited twice a year by our homestay coordinator.

Study Plans

Kew High School takes international students at Senior School level only. Most international students require two terms of intensive English Language Training before they start mainstream classes. There are two intakes at our own ELC during a school year:

- February Intake: for students who have finished half of their Year 10 in their home countries
- July Intake: for students who have finished a complete Year 10 in their home countries

The above study plans ensure that our students have reached a certain level of personal and academic maturity to meet the challenges of studying overseas. Interviews are applicable to prospective students.
